

Checklist for Evaluating Bible Teachers

1. What did you like about the teaching?
2. What do you see as this teacher's strengths?
3. Was the lesson aim clear from the teaching itself?
4. Did the teacher use a variety of methods?
5. Did the students participate in a number of ways?
6. Did the teacher break up the lesson into small portions?
7. Did the teacher stay on theme, with all teaching reinforcing lesson aim?
8. Did the teacher use the memory verse in the lesson? (Not teach it, use it)
9. Did the teacher make the lesson FUN?
10. Did the teacher use a repetitive word or phrase that detracted from his teaching (like well, umm, aaa)?
11. Did the songs used break up the teaching and reinforce the lesson?
12. Did the teacher teach with Bible in hand?
13. Did the teacher use an appropriate and interest-getting introduction?
14. Did the introduction lead into the Bible story?
15. At the conclusion of the Bible story, did the teacher give an appropriate and specific application to life?
16. Did the teacher keep it moving?
17. What was the teacher's level of enthusiasm?
18. What was the students' level?
19. Was the teaching true to both the specifics of the passage and the overall teaching of the Bible?
